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Getting In Front of the Camera

Almost everyone who steps in front of my camera tells they're not photogenic and are don't like seeing themselves in pictures. If that describes how you feel about having your new images taken, congrats! You're in the perfect mindset to have an awesome set of headshots created!

The key to feeling more comfortable during your session is knowing what to expect and how to prepare for it. This guide is designed to give you lots of information about how my sessions work and to let you know how many of my other clients have felt about theirs. You'll learn what looks great in the camera, the types of clothing to avoid, tips for hair, makeup, and more. You'll be surprised how easy it is to look great in front of the camera!

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What to Wear

Bring plenty of looks with you to the studio. Even if you're unsure of a certain article, take it along. Sometimes it turns out to look the best on camera.

Here are some simple guidelines to follow.

- 1. Know Your Target Market:** Make sure the clothing you select is industry appropriate. If you're a financial advisor, don't dress like you've got a dog walking business. And if you own a dog walking business, don't dress like a financial advisor.
- 2. Make sure your clothing doesn't "steal the show."** It's *you* that's being featured, not your wardrobe. Unless it's part of your brand, avoid loud patterns and logos. Solid colors always best.
- 3. Clean & Wrinkle Free:** Look sharp! Regardless of what you're wearing, your clothing should look crisp, clean, pressed, and new. This is your chance to make the best first impression on potential clients and employers.

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Hair & Makeup

Did you know we work with some of Seattle's best hair and makeup artists? Over the years, our clients are happiest with their results when they use one of our professional artists here in the studio, and we strongly recommend you take advantage of this opportunity. This way we're able to take several test shots before your session and make any necessary adjustments.

However, if you choose to do your own styling or use another artist, here are a couple of helpful guidelines you should follow.

1. Keep your foundation light and simple so we can see the texture in your skin. Don't worry about covering blemishes. It's very easy to remove temporary marks during the retouching process.
2. Keep your hair out of your face. Not only can it hide your eyes, but it also causes shadows that make it difficult to create a flattering image of you.



Our Lighting

Most subjects are surprised, and even intimidated by, just how close they light are to their face. So close, in fact, that two of them will actually be in your photos! (Don't worry, they'll be removed from the images you select.)

Why are the lights so close? Because the closer they are and the more precisely they're positioned, the better you look. Our lighting is the most important technical element of our style and has been carefully designed to properly illuminate the face, reduce the impact of lines and, most importantly, make sure your eyes are properly illuminated in your images.

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The Session

Your session is completely collaborative. I want to hear your suggestions and how you're feeling as we progress. I'll be coaching you through various expressions, your posing, and probably saying a few crazy things to get some natural reactions. We'll review the images as we go along to make sure you're happy with the progress. Your session doesn't end until *you* feel you've got a great set of images to select from.



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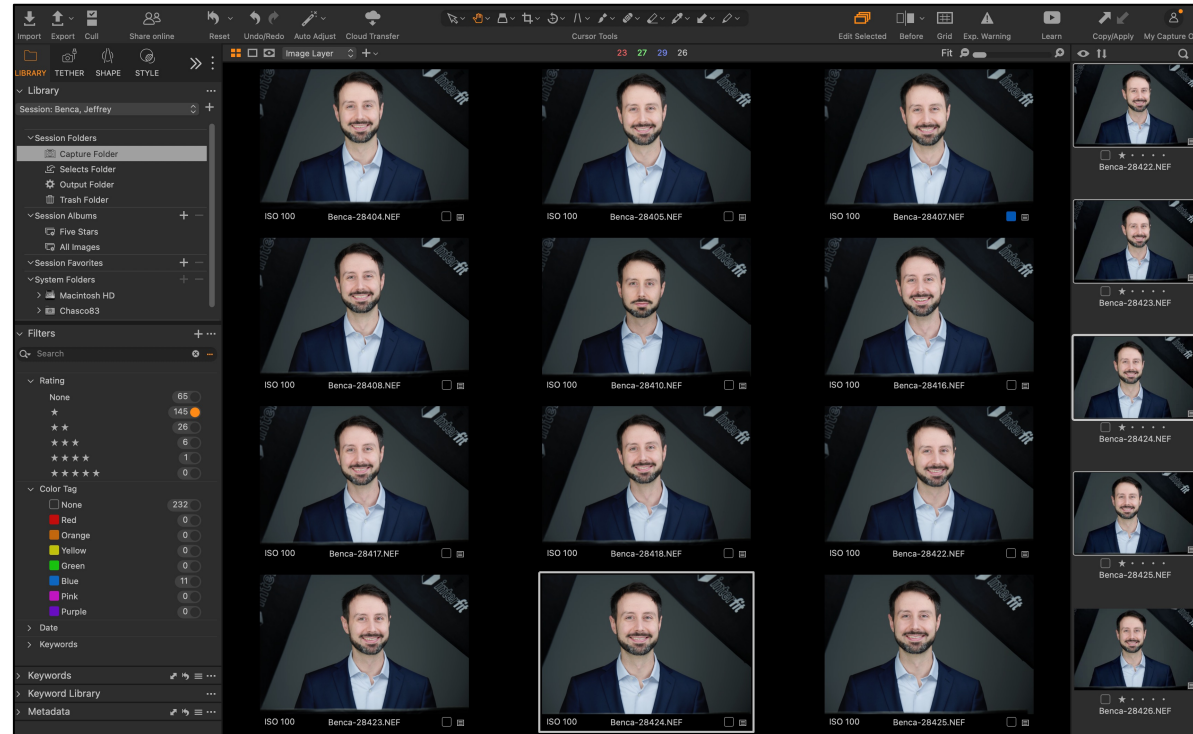
Expression Coaching

As important as the lighting, your clothing, and every other aspect of your headshot is, they don't mean anything if your expression isn't authentic.

Based on the goals for your images, we'll coach you through a series of expressions, head positions, types of smiles and more. Some of the techniques will feel a bit awkward at first. But once you get the hang of it, you'll see how much they improve your images. And there's no arguing with the results; you'll have some amazing new headshots that showcase your confidence, approachability, and professionalism!



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The Guided Image Selection Process

As soon as you feel we've created a great collection of images to select from, we'll get right into the selection process. Your images will be reviewed on a large monitor where we can get a better look at them, compare multiple photos at a time, and find the ones that will best serve your needs. We'll immediately start the retouching process and you're on your way with nothing else to worry about!

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Retouching

Your selected images will go through a three-part retouching process. First is color correction. Second is the main work on the image including removing blemishes and temporary marks, reducing any lines and bags under the eyes, removing stray hairs, minor physical modifications, and any necessary lighting modifications. Last is the final touches, those little details that make your images shine! Typical turnaround time is five business days. Your retouched images are typically delivered within five business days as full-frame high resolution and LinkedIn sized JPEG files.

Pricing

In-Studio Professional Headshot Session: \$490

Unlimited time and unlimited outfit changes followed by guided image selection. Recommended for people without a lot of experience in front of the camera or want to try multiple outfits and looks.

Images sold separately.

In-Studio Hair & Makeup Artist: \$250

*If you plan on wearing makeup, it is **strongly recommended** you reserve one of our experienced artists to apply your makeup and refresh your hairstyle.*

Retouching: \$290/Image*

Your selected images are retouched to reflect the best version of your current self. Includes removal of stray hairs, skin cleanup, reduction of lines/bags under eyes, teeth whitening, etc.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Do you create headshots in your studio or on location?

Both! You can come to me, I can bring my remote studio to you, or we can create your headshots in your preferred environment.

How long is a headshot session?

While there's no time limit to your session, on average you can expect to spend anywhere from one to two and a half hours creating your new headshots and making your selections. But we'll take as much time as you need!

Do you offer hair and makeup services?

Yes! We work with some of Seattle's best makeup artists. When [booking online](#), select the option including your hair and makeup artist or let us know if book by [phone](#) or [email](#).

Is there a limit to how many images you create?

No. We'll create as many images as necessary, reviewing them as we go along, until you feel we've captured a great set of images for you to select from.

Do you create headshots for performing artists?

Yes! I spent fifteen years making my living as an actor and musician, so I have a good understanding of the types of images you need for agencies, casting directors, and promo packages.

How do I select my images?

The selection process takes place immediately after your session. We will sit down and view them on a large screen, so you're not left to select them without any professional guidance.

Will you retouch my images?

Yes! Your selected images will include skin cleanup, removal of excessive stray hairs, teeth whitening, eye enhancement, etc. Depending on complexity, other enhancements may require additional fees.

How will you deliver my images?

Within a week, each one of your retouched images will be emailed to you. Images for organizations may take longer and will be delivered via a file sharing service or uploaded to your FTP server.

Can I have the unretouched images?

We do not release any images that have not been through the retouching process.
